HOME INVASION IN HARRISON TOWNSHIP

Harrison Township, October 26, 2014 – Hamilton County Sheriff Jim Neil reports the arrest of two male juveniles for a home invasion robbery that occurred on October 26, 2014 in the 10000 block of Carolina Trace Road. At approximately 8:55 a.m. two male subjects wearing ski masks forced entry into the residence and physically restrained the male homeowner and demanded valuables when he confronted them. After being told that the victim's wife was dialing 911, the two males fled the residence in an older model black Chevy Cavalier type vehicle without further harm to the victims or taking any property.

Shortly after the arrival of responding Deputies, officers from the Harrison Police Department located a vehicle matching the given description approximately two miles away from the incident location. These officers initiated a stop on the vehicle and were able to stop it in the 300 block of Elm Avenue in Harrison. After a brief investigation, it was determined that this was indeed the vehicle and both occupants were detained.

After being interviewed by detectives from the Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigation Section, both 16 year old juvenile suspects admitted to the offense and were charged with one count each of Aggravated Burglary and transported to the County Juvenile Detention facility at 2020 Auburn Avenue.
