MUTIPLE VEHICLE AND SCHOOL BUS CRASH ANDERSON TOWNSHIP

Anderson Township, October 31, 2014 – Hamilton County Sheriff Jim Neil reports a multiple vehicle and school bus crash in the 2200 block of Wolfangel Road.

At approximately 2:33 pm, a 16 year old male was operating his vehicle, 2002 Toyota Camry, southbound on Wolfangel Rd. As he attempted to negotiate a curve in the roadway, he lost control of his vehicle in the rain and crossed over the double yellow line. The Toyota then struck a Forest Hills school bus with children on board. The Toyota was then redirected back onto his side of the roadway. A 1997 Toyota Camry was behind the first Toyota and crashed into it when it stopped in the lane of travel. A fourth vehicle, a 2001 Chrysler Sebring, had been traveling behind the bus. When the bus became suddenly disabled in the roadway, the Chrysler was unable to stop on the wet roadway and slid into the rear bumper of the bus.

There were a total of 24 students and one driver on the bus at the time of the crash. Anderson Township Fire Department transported the driver of the bus to Mercy Anderson Hospital for minor injuries. None of the students were injured. The driver and occupants of the three other vehicles were also not injured. They were all wearing their safety restraints when the crash occurred. Drugs and Alcohol were not a factor in the crash.

The 16 year old was cited for Failing to Maintain Reasonable Control of his vehicle (4511.202 orc).
