## LEVEL 2 SNOW EMERGENCY DOWNGRADED TO LEVEL 1 SNOW EMERGENCY

**Hamilton County Ohio, February 21** – Hamilton County Sheriff Jim Neil reports that the Level Two (2) Snow Emergency has been downgraded to a Level One (1) Snow Emergency for all of Hamilton County, effective February 21, 2015 at 6:30 P.M. This Order will remain in effect until further notice.

Level One (1) means: Roadways are hazardous with blowing and drifting snow.

Citizens of all municipalities, townships and unincorporated areas of Hamilton County should immediately remove any vehicle(s) parked in a designated Snow Emergency Lane.

For information purposes - Under Ohio Law, Sheriff's have a responsibility to monitor snow conditions and to declare a "snow emergency" when it has been determined that highway conditions within their respective jurisdictions are such that unrestricted use of the highways by motorists is a threat to maintaining the public peace. Reference: Ohio Revised Code, Sections 311.07 and 311.08; and Ohio Attorney General Opinions 86-023 and 97-015
