Cincinnati, Ohio December 23, 2015- Hamilton County Sheriff Jim Neil reports the sentencing today of Kenneth Gentry age 32, of 5160 Montgomery Road before Judge Patrick J. Dinkelacker in his Hamilton County Common pleas courtroom. Kenneth *Gentry* was sentenced to 10 years in prison for his conviction of Involuntary Manslaughter and Drug Trafficking.

Kenneth Gentry was arrested by Agents of the Regional Narcotics Unit in June of 2015 after a Hamilton County Grand Jury indicted him on Involuntary Manslaughter and Corrupting another with Drugs in the death of Scott Kehrer age 38 of Arlington Heights, Ohio.

Scott Kehrer was found unconscious at a residence in Lockland on January 30, 2015. EMS transported him to Jewish Hospital and on February 1, 2015 Scott Kehrer died as a result of an overdose of Fentanyl according to the Hamilton County Coroner's Office.

RENU Agents initiated an investigation in April after identifying Kenneth Gentry as the individual who supplied Scott Kehrer with heroin that was cut with Fentanyl which caused Scott Kehrer's overdose and death.

Kenneth Gentry and his girlfriend Leeanna Bowling age 26, were both arrested and indicted by a Hamilton County Grand Jury for Possession and Trafficking in Drugs (heroin). Leeanna Bowling pled guilty to two counts of Drug Trafficking and received a sentence of two years' probation.
