PURSUIT ENDS WITH SUSPECTS IN CUSTODY

Columbia Township, October 4, 2016 – Hamilton County Sheriff Jim Neil reports the arrest of two individuals following a traffic pursuit that was initiated by Sheriff's Deputies and Madeira Police Units at E. Galbraith and Montgomery Roads. At approximately 6:45 a.m. the Hamilton County Communications Center was advised by Clermont County Dispatch that an unconfirmed stolen vehicle occupied by a two persons who were armed were possibly en route to an address in Madeira. Additional information provided stated the male passenger of the vehicle was involved in an Officer Involved Shooting situation in Northern Ohio on an unspecified date. Madeira Police and Sheriff's Units staged in the area of the residence to await their arrival. At approximately 7:20 a.m., Madeira units identified the vehicle in the area and began following it. When backup units arrived to assist the Madeira unit, an attempted stop was initiated on the vehicle on E. Galbraith Rd. at Montgomery Rd. The vehicle fled from the stop Westbound on East Galbraith Rd. with officers from the Sheriff's Office and Madeira in pursuit. The pursuit continued through multiple jurisdictions including Madeira, Sycamore Township, Blue Ash, Silverton, the City of Cincinnati and Columbia Township before culminating with the vehicle crashing on Ridge Road in the 5400 block.

Taken into custody following the crash was the driver, identified as Kimberly Overstreet, F/W/26 of Cincinnati, Ohio. Ms. Overstreet is facing several felony charges in both Union Township, Clermont County and Hamilton County, including Theft, Felony Fleeing and Eluding and Aggravated Vehicular Assault. More charges are pending further investigation. Also taken into custody was the passenger, Kenneth Maldonado, M/W/27 of Union Township, Clermont County. Mr. Maldonado is currently on Probation in Wood County, Ohio for his part in an incident in Perrysburg, Ohio which resulted in the death of one of his two associates in an officer involved shooting in December of 2015. Mr. Maldonado was transported to University Hospital, treated and released for minor injuries before being turned over to Union Township for charges related to the theft of the vehicle.
