SHERIFF'S DEPUTY STRUCK IN THE VILLAGE OF SILVERTON

Village of Silverton, October 28, 2016 – Hamilton County Sheriff Jim Neil reports that a Sheriff's Deputy was struck by a stolen vehicle. The incident occurred on Section Road at Kenton Avenue, in the Village of Silverton at 1:06 p.m., today.

A 2015 Honda Pilot occupied by two male suspects was stopped by Sheriff's Deputy Oliver Albert and Special Deputy Albert Caldwell for disobeying a stop sign on Ohio Avenue at Section Road. The Honda pulled into a parking lot on Section Road at Kenton Avenue.

During the initial contact it was discovered that the driver was not licensed and was asked to exit the vehicle. At this point the driver placed the vehicle into reverse striking and pinning Deputy Caldwell between the vehicles.

Deputy Albert was able to radio the Hamilton County Communications Center for assistance. Officers from Amberley Village, Blue Ash, Cincinnati, Deer Park, Golf Manor Departments and the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office responded to the call for help.

After fleeing the scene the suspect vehicle crashed into a wooded area on Kincaid Avenue near Section Road. Both suspects fled on foot into the wooded area. The Sheriff's Helicopter and a canine unit from Amberley Village were utilized to help in the search for the suspects. The two suspects remain at large after an extensive 2 hour search. The suspects are described as:

1. Male, black, black hair, brown eyes, wearing a black button down dress shirt, black tie, black vest and pants.
2. Male, white, black Cincinnati Reds t-shirt, khaki shorts, red and black Cincinnati Reds ball cap, and tattoos on both arms.

Special Deputy Albert Caldwell, 76, was transported to Good Samaritan Hospital by the Deer Park/Silverton Joint Fire Department for non-life threatening injuries to his lower extremities. Caldwell has since been released.

The offense is being investigated by the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigations Division.
