FELONIOUS ASSAULT, SHOOTING

Village of Lincoln Heights, February 4th 2021 – Hamilton County Sheriff Charmaine McGuffey reports a shooting that occurred in the 1100 block of Van Buren Ave. in Lincoln Heights. At 5:06 pm Deputies were dispatched to the area of 1145 Van Buren for a report of an auto accident. Officers were then updated that shots had been reported fired in the area. Responding deputies located an auto accident scene at the intersection of Van Buren and Leggett. One of the vehicles, a Saturn Vue, silver in color, was found to be abandoned. Witnesses stated that three subjects had fled from the Silver Saturn.

A short time later Officers from the Lockland Police department who had come to Lincoln Heights to assist, located two Subjects on Medosh Ln. who were suffering from gunshot wounds. J'shawn Crews, Male 19 YOA was found to be suffering from a gunshot wound to his right shoulder. He was transported to UC Medical Center for treatment. A Male 16 YOA was also found to be suffering from a gunshot wound to his Left shoulder. He was transported to Children's Hospital Medical Center for treatment. Neither of their injuries are believed to be life threatening. The third subject who fled from the scene has not been located at this time.

The shooting victims stated that they were fired upon by unknown assailant(s) while parked on Van Buren. When they were fired upon, they fled in their Saturn and caused the collision at the intersection of Van Buren and Leggett. None of the passengers in the vehicle that was struck complained of injuries.
